


KRISTI HOUSE FY 2021 - 2022

Highlights of Services and Community Involvement



Core Services

Kristi House continued providing its specialized services for treating child sexual abuse as well as other child traumas wrought by abuse, family and community violence. The Kristi House Children's Advocacy Center nearly 2,000 referrals of children with allegations of abuse and worked with its seven agency-partners to heal the victims and hold the perpetrators responsible. Services remained 100% free to children and families and included Therapy, Family Advocacy, Transportation, Emergency Support and Education.

Prevention Education & Training

A record 14,425 individuals – including service providers, parents, youth and other community members – participated in education and training courses presented by Kristi House's team of four multilingual education specialists. The team presented 448 hours of instruction in 263 different sessions. Kristi House and 11 experts presented the second annual Human Trafficking Symposium in January to more than 500 participants from South Florida and around the country. New programs in mental wellbeing were rolled out with major support from Florida Blue Foundation and the Frederick A. De Luca Foundation.

Child Sex Trafficking – Project GOLD Program

Project GOLD continued to serve teen girls overcoming sex trafficking at the two Drop-In Centers, with 78 members receiving services during the year. In addition to care coordination, therapy and enrichment programs of all types, the program helped girls catch up in school, obtain GEDs, and continue their education. Members participating in the Project GOLD "Bridges to the Future" job training and career planning program that began in January 2019 racked up tremendous accomplishments: 117 job placements were secured, 16 enrollments were made into post-secondary education and vocational programs, 15 high school diplomas were earned, eight internships were landed, and three certification programs were completed.

Professional Development for Staff and the Field

Kristi House continued its commitment to measuring and analyzing its work to enable us to evaluate outcomes and share what we learn within the field. We are proud to have distinguished research partners at Florida International University and University of Miami who guide this work and enable dissemination of our findings through peer-reviewed journals. Four articles were published in academic journals in FY 2021-22 in *Child Abuse Review*, *Journal of Human Trafficking*, *Journal of Traumatic Stress*, and *Psychological Trauma*. Five sessions were presented at major statewide and national conferences.

Trainings provided for Kristi House staff and community partners included a six-month learning collaborative in Motivational Interviewing, a day-long program on the impact of family violence on children and a two-day workshop on secondary trauma for direct service workers and clinicians.


January 14, 2022

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
Community Outreach to Migrant Families



February 25, 2022

Kristi House's Project GOLD joined the South Florida Human Trafficking Task Force (SFHTTF) and partners at an outreach event for migrant families in Homestead. Project GOLD's Homestead location which opened in 2021 serves girls who have experienced or are at risk of commercial exploitation in the southern regions of Miami-Dade County.

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
April – June 2022

Expanding Expertise at Conferences & Trainings



July – August 2022

Kristi House staff expanded their expertise the Florida Network of Children’s Advocacy Centers *Krimes Against Kids* Annual Conference, in order to provide the best quality of care to children and families.

Additionally, with the rise in family violence, Kristi House hosted a one-day training for its staff and community partners, *Family Violence & the Brain*. Dr. Geffner covered current issues, research, and controversies as well as assessment and treatment approaches and techniques involving child maltreatment, children exposed to domestic violence, child trauma, and parenting.



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Mental Health Programming: Project HeadSTRONG



May 2022 - ongoing

In May, Kristi House launched Project HeadSTRONG, Mental Well-Being Programs for adults and youth. One part of HeadSTRONG is Mental Health Mondays, free community programs to help adults cope with the challenges life throws their way. Four sessions on the first topic, Anger, were held in May. Attendees learned how to recognize signs and symptoms, identify coping strategies, develop communication skills, and plan for ongoing support.

In July, four sessions on the second topic, Self-Esteem & Self-Compassion, we held. Participants learned exercises to focus on the connection between thinking patterns, values, goals, habits, and relationships and their influence on self-esteem, in addition to offering strategies for building their self-compassion.



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


Community Support for Clients, Operations



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
January – March 2022
