## MISSION

Kristi House is dedicated to treating and preventing child sexual abuse, trafficking and other childhood trauma, working closely with community partners, parents and providers.

## PROGRAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Kristi House provided services to 1,570 children and their families during CY 2023 at its main center and satellite locations in Miami-Dade County. A staff of 73 full-time and eight part-time members provided advocacy, therapy, transportation, education and other supportive services to help children and their families heal from the trauma of sexual abuse, sex trafficking and other child trauma.

## PARTNERS KEY TO SUCCESSFUL APPROACH

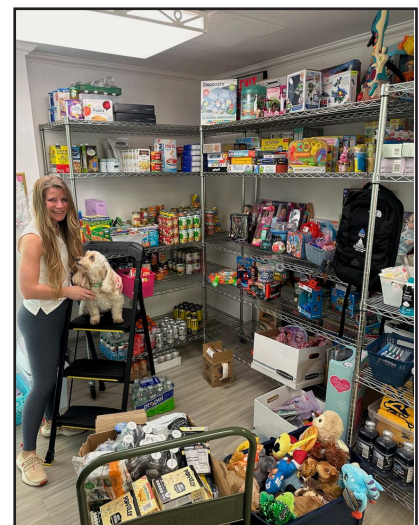

We provide children and their families with proven, evidence-based mental health services, which enable them to get past the trauma and go on with their lives. In most cases, children and youth who complete treatment with Kristi House are stronger than ever.

**IT IS IMPORTANT THAT CHILDREN** who experience abuse and other forms of trauma get help from experienced professionals. Most victims left untreated face life-long serious emotional and social consequences — depression, anxiety, post traumatic stress disorder, substance abuse, physical health problems, education and career challenges — to name a few.

**TO OVERCOME POTENTIALLY DEVASTATING, LONG-LASTING EFFECTS,** Kristi House coordinates all the services a victim and the family will need for the healing process. We provide treatment, link families to other needed community resources, and serve as a bridge to law enforcement.

**KRISTI HOUSE IS A BEACON OF HOPE** for families, fortified by our dedicated Multi-disciplinary Team partners and the tremendous support we receive from the community.

**WITH THE CONTINUED SUPPORT** of a caring community and committed board, staff and volunteers, we pledge to continue our work to eradicate child sexual abuse and sex trafficking, and to heal the future. ■

# Highlights of Community Impact

## CORE SERVICES

Kristi House continued providing its specialized services for treating child sexual abuse as well as other child traumas wrought by abuse, grief, family and community violence. At the Children's Advocacy Center, eight agency partners worked to heal the victims and hold the perpetrators responsible. Kristi House **services remained 100% free to children and families** and included Therapy, Family Advocacy, Transportation, Emergency Support and Prevention Education and Training.

## PREVENTION EDUCATION AND TRAINING

Kristi House reached **13,242** service providers, parents, youth and other community members with education and training courses presented by our team of multilingual education specialists.

- We continued expanding our programs in **mental wellbeing** thanks to continued support from Florida Blue Foundation, the Frederick A. DeLuca Foundation and Heckscher Foundation for Children.
- Kristi House educators and Project GOLD leaders presented their third annual **Human Trafficking Symposium** in January 2023 with 815 participants logging in from South Florida and around the country.
- We added safety and prevention geared for **K-3**, social & emotional health reading circles for small children at local libraries, and trainings on **community violence and trauma**.
- We introduced new evidence-based curricula including from the One Love organization that covers intimate **healthy and unhealthy relationships** for teens.

## PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR STAFF AND THE FIELD

- Trainings provided for Kristi House staff and community partners included a six-month learning collaborative on **Motivational Interviewing**, a program on the impact of **family violence** on children, a day-long symposium on fostering **teen resiliency**, and a two-day workshop on **secondary trauma** for direct service workers and clinicians and a day learning about **trauma and risky behaviors**.
- Kristi House continued sharing what we learn with the field with the help of our distinguished research partners at **Florida International University** and **University of Miami** who guide this work and enable dissemination of our findings in scholarly, peer-reviewed journals.
- Staff presented five sessions at major statewide and national conferences.
- Began year-long community based learning collaborative training and practice program on **Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy** for 60 clinicians and care coordinators from throughout Miami as part of our C-START project.

## SUSTAINING OUR WORK...

- Began second three-year U.S. Department of Justice grant to provide young women in **Project GOLD** with educational support, jobs training and career planning in our *"Bridges to the Future"* program.
- Began five-year grant from **The Children's Trust** to lead community-wide human trafficking work.
- Continued expansion of our social media **reach**. ■

# Programs

## THERAPY



**T**herapy is a critical component in helping children overcome the trauma of abuse. While child sexual abuse has been Kristi House's specialty since founding, its mental health unit has the proven treatment interventions for many types of childhood trauma including problematic sexual behavior, physical abuse, and substance abuse combined with trauma. Kristi House is one of very few agencies in Miami-Dade County providing specialized mental health services for child trauma regardless of families' ability to pay. Because untreated child trauma often manifests itself in health, sexual and social problems throughout life, it is vitally important that Kristi House provides abused children with mental health services. ■

## FAMILY ADVOCACY

**B**ecause the legal system can be difficult to negotiate, and gaining access to supportive agencies and therapy can also be complicated, Kristi House Family Advocates work directly with families to facilitate these processes. They determine the needs of children and families, make referrals for needed services, and assist families in accessing those services. They also coordinate services with our partner-agencies in the Center and community to help reduce system trauma. Kristi House provides a vital support system to victims, encouraging them to pursue all avenues of treatment and all legal means to stop the abuse and ensure long-term recovery. ■



## TRANSPORTATION

**P**roviding transportation is critical to many of the families we serve, enabling access and improving client outcomes. Public transportation does not reach many of our families who are without vehicles. Kristi House added a fourth transportation route this year in the southern end of Miami-Dade to help ensure children can get to us in one of our five locations. Project GOLD drivers transport girls every afternoon for group programs, therapy and educational support at the Drop In Center. Transportation ensures all children and teens can get to Kristi House services safely. ■



# PROYECTO BRAZOS ABIERTOS

Kristi House's *Proyecto Brazos Abiertos* (Project Open Arms) began in 2019 to provide free, evidence-based therapy and care coordination services to minors designated as unaccompanied minors immigrating to the U.S. who have experienced trauma. Many of these youth are in residence at shelters in South Florida while efforts are made to place them with relatives or other sponsors in the U.S.



A large portion of these youth, some of whom have been separated from their parents upon arrival, are suffering from separation trauma, anxiety and PTSD symptoms as a result of their journeys and their experiences in their home countries. Kristi House is continuing to provide services when needed for post-release youth who have been placed with families. ■

# Education and Outreach

**W**ith national studies finding 1 in 4 girls and 1 in 6 boys will be sexually abused by the age of 18, and 1 out of 2 children suffering some type of trauma during their childhood, Kristi House is dedicated to child abuse prevention through training and education. We deliver best practice programs for schools, community groups, corporations and faith-based organizations, with different courses specifically geared for children, parents and service providers. Since founding, Kristi House has provided classes, training and education programs to more than 157,400 participants. We continue to focus on ways to secure support to expand education and outreach to keep more kids safe. ■

## MIAMI C-START PROJECT

**K**risti House reached hundreds of Miami therapists and case workers with training in evidence-based interventions through its C-START project, carried out in 2012-2022 with major federal support.

Kristi House's decade of success and its plan to further expand training garnered another five years of funding for C-START from the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services – Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA). The goal of C-START remains to increase community-wide capacity to treat child trauma.

Kristi House will bring master trainers to Miami to lead yearlong training and practice programs on screening, referring and delivering evidence-based interventions.



Learning collaboratives will focus on Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy, and its cultural modifications for Hispanic/Latino families; Problematic Sexual Behavior Cognitive Behavioral Therapy; and Risk Reduction through Family Therapy.

In 2023-28, Kristi House will also focus on trauma and underserved communities. ■





# Child Sex Trafficking

## PROJECT GOLD

**P**roject GOLD uses a strengths-based, survivor-led approach for commercially sexually exploited girls and those at risk. The Drop In Center — unique in South Florida — provides a home-like setting for engagement and delivery of restorative services, including care management, therapy, advocacy, transportation, education and recreational enrichment. It provides an alternative to a dangerous life of abuse and exploitation.

Project GOLD began its *Bridges to the Future* initiative after recognizing that in addition to wraparound services, positive adults, and a trauma-informed, survivor-focused approach, girls need vocational training, job skills and career planning to help them pursue productive futures. Launched in early 2019, *Bridges to the Future* is addressing this vital component with tutoring, financial counseling, job readiness assistance, and support for educational and professional certifications, internships and apprenticeships. The program

seeks to help girls identify their strengths to forge

linkages and routes out of trafficking. It is supported by a major grant from the U.S. Department of Justice-Office for Victims of Crime, and private funders. Corporate partners and community organizations provide internship opportunities.

During its first four years, despite the pandemic and all its challenges, young women in the *Bridges* program achieved tremendous outcomes:

- 109 participants
- 137 job placements
- 23 enrollments in post secondary education and vocational programs
- 15 returned to high school and graduated
- 8 internships
- 5 completed certification programs. ■



*Staying Tough, Resilient and Optimistic when life's Not Great.*

**K**risti House began a mental well-being initiative in 2022 with a focus on helping Miamians cope with life's challenges.

Project HeadSTRONG features *Mental Health Mondays*, a series of four-part programs on six key topics: Anxiety, Grief, Depression, Anger, Shame & Guilt, and Self-esteem & Self-care. All are invited to join these community

programs to help cope with the trials life throws one's way. Sessions take place virtually on Mondays from 12 noon to 2 pm.

Other Project HeadSTRONG components are focused on delivering mental wellbeing programs to children and youth in schools and community settings, as well as to service providers who are serving children, youth and families.

All programs are free of charge thanks to the generous support of the Florida Blue Foundation. ■

### **MANDATED REPORTER AND WHAT IT MEANS**

In Florida, any person who knows, or has reasonable cause to suspect that a child is abused, neglected, or abandoned by a parent, legal custodian, caregiver, or other person responsible for the child's welfare shall immediately report such knowledge or suspicion to the Abuse Hotline of the Florida Department of Children and Families at 1-(800) 96ABUSE.

### **SERVICES AT NO COST TO FAMILIES**

Kristi House does not charge for its services and never turns away a child in need. This is possible thanks to support from individuals, corporations and community groups, along with public grant funds, that ensure quality services and programs to children in Miami-Dade County. All gifts to Kristi House are tax-deductible.

## **Steps Adults Can Take to Protect Children from Sexual Abuse**

These guidelines provide simple and practical actions you can take to prevent, recognize, and react responsibly to child sexual abuse.

### **STEP 1 : LEARN THE FACTS**

The facts about child sexual abuse can be staggering, but they can help us understand the risks children face.

### **STEP 2 : MINIMIZE OPPORTUNITY**

If you eliminate opportunities for children to be in isolated, one-on-one situations, you can dramatically reduce the risk of abuse.

### **STEP 3 : TALK ABOUT IT**

Children often keep abuse a secret, but talking openly about our bodies, sex, and boundaries can encourage children to share.

### **STEP 4 : RECOGNIZE THE SIGNS**

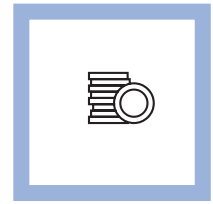
Don't expect obvious signs when a child is being abused. Signs are often there, but you have to know what to look for.

### **STEP 5 : REACT RESPONSIBLY**

Be prepared to react responsibly if a child discloses abuse to you, or if you suspect or see that boundaries have been violated.

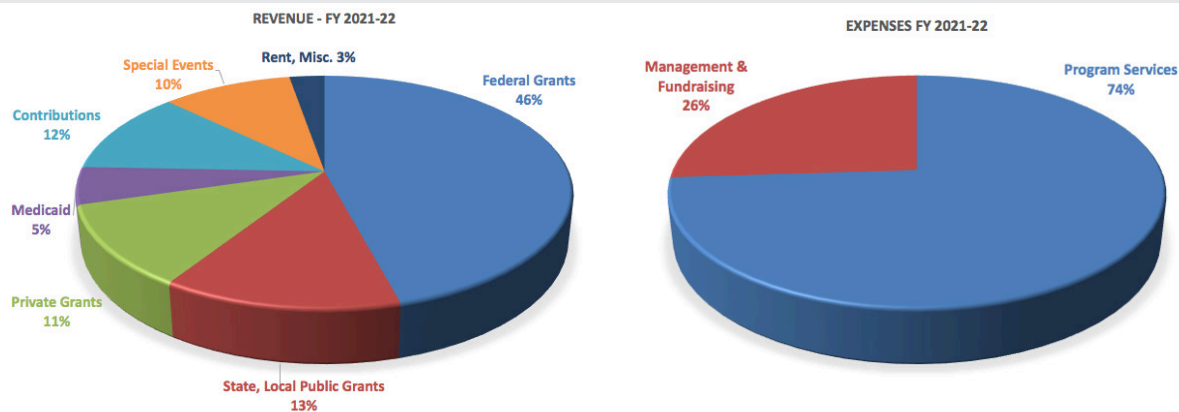

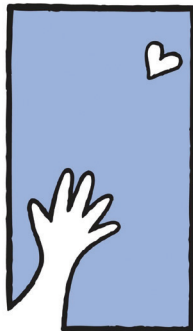
